Bible Readings from Monday 5 March to Easter Day

Around 25% of each gospel is taken up with the last week of Jesus' life, and this year we invite you to join Jesus on his journey to the Cross, following his footsteps, his teaching and his suffering through that last week. You may want to choose to follow one gospel – but you may also like to read more than one, to build up a fuller picture of Jesus' final days. An interesting idea would be to choose one of Matthew, Mark & Luke – and then read the daily passages from John as well. That would give a broad understanding of all that happened.



'Lectio Divina'

We encourage you to use this ancient practice of 'Lectio Divina', whose 4 components are

- Reading
- Meditation
- Prayer
- Contemplation
- Pray before you begin something like: Holy Spirit, author of scripture, breathe afresh on your living Word, bringing it alive to us in new ways; that our hearts & minds may receive fresh insight, encouragement, challenge and direction from it.
- Read the passage through twice at normal reading speed
- Pray again and then read it again much more slowly
- · Meditate on what you've read, mentally noting anything which strikes you
- Read it again, this time underlining or making notes of anything which strikes you you may
 - be reminded of a long-known truth
 - see something you've never noticed before scripture is endlessly rich
 - find that God highlights a particular phrase or even one word which speaks to a particular situation you are facing at the moment.

Some groups may find it helpful to read the passage aloud – and don't forget that we'll be reading Mark's account of the last week of Jesus' life at 9 am on the 5 Saturday mornings leading up to Easter, starting this Saturday, 3 March in Jacobs Well.

Underline words or phrases that speak to you – make notes as you read of anything you think the Lord might be highlighting or saying. Don't worry initially about understanding – just try to be attentive to what comes to mind. There's nothing wrong with 'practising' our spiritual disciplines – just as we would practise any skill we are learning in life – and therefore there's no problem with mistakes as we learn!

Then pray in what you learn.

Questions as you read, pray and meditate through each passage

- Why is this in the Bible? What 'general' truth does it reveal?
- What shines out to me?
- Does this passage raise any questions?
- Where do you see Jesus in this passage and what do you learn about him?
- Personal application what is the Lord saying to me in this passage?
- Is there something I need to share with others?
