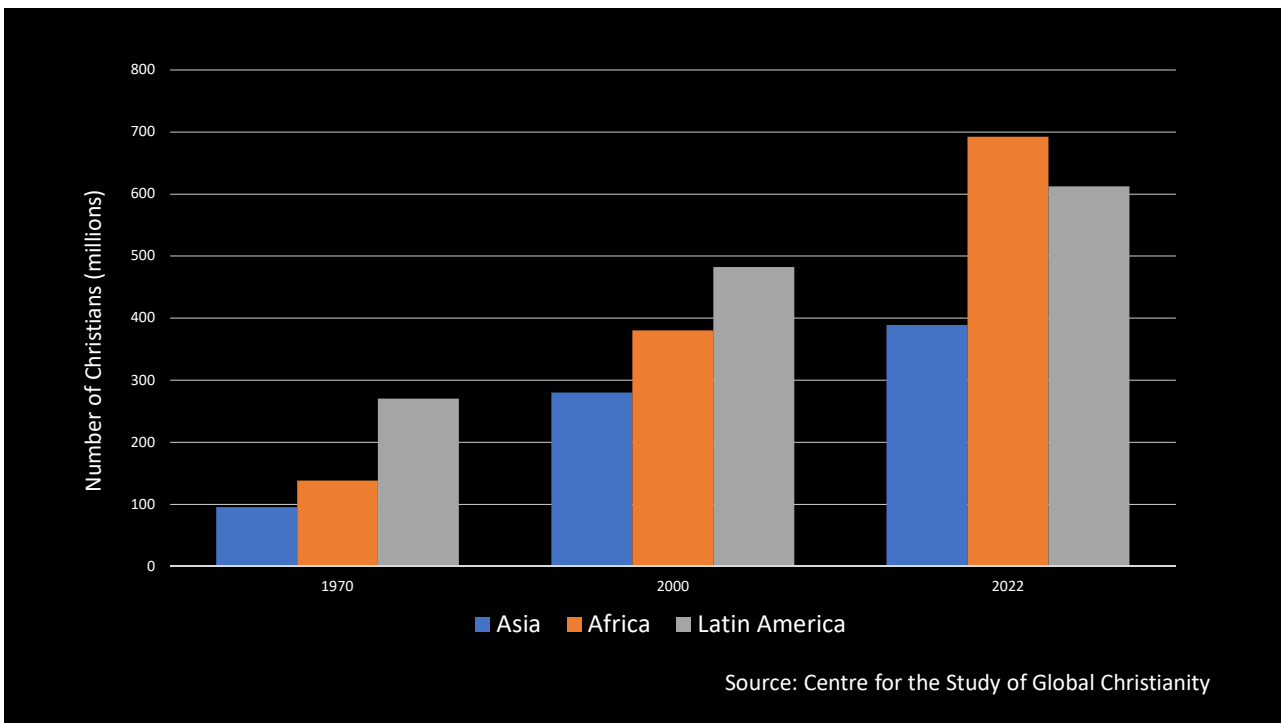
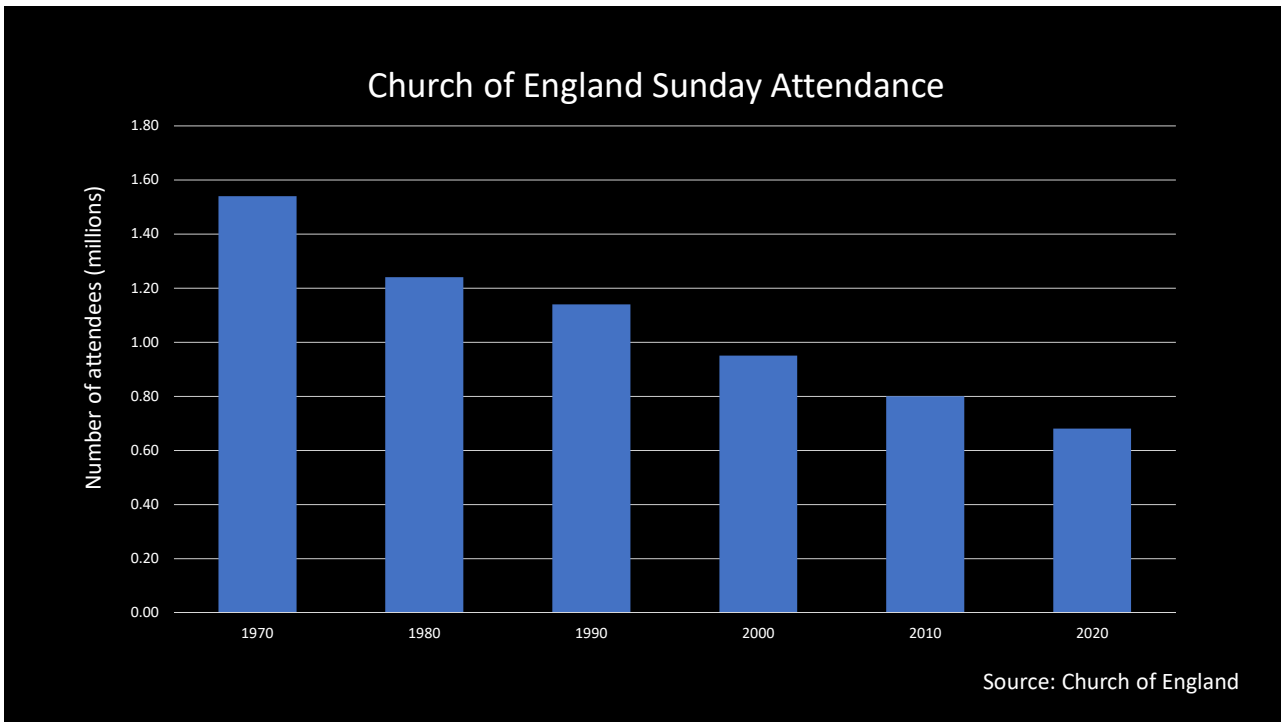
Matthew 28:18-20
